Dr. Henderson serves as a co-chair board member of Pearl IRB. As a member of Pearl IRB, Dr. Henderson assumes responsibilities for approving, monitoring, and reviewing medical and behavioral research involving humans.

After completing his Doctor of Osteopathic Medicine, Dr. Henderson began working as an Internist in both rural and urban settings. He also has extensive experience working as a hospitalist at a tertiary care facility. Throughout his career, he has been greatly involved in clinical research, with special emphasis granted to early-onset dementia, public health policy, organ transplantation, disparities in health care delivery, and palliative care. His clinical experience includes serving as an assisted living medical director and primary care practice in correctional facilities.

Furthermore, Dr. Henderson completed his Doctor of Jurisprudence and began work as a Medical-Legal Consultant at Brown Law Firm, PC, where he acted as a medical-legal consultant on several medical and pharmaceutical negligence lawsuits. Dr. Henderson currently serves as the Director of Research and Medical Affairs Liaison at HERO Network, LLC. His responsibilities include regulatory analysis and compliance services, collaborating with a team of independent contractors who focus on program development, grant funding, and management of research initiatives, and consulting as a pharmacovigilance physician and medical monitor for Phase II-IV clinical trials.

Dr. Henderson received his Doctor of Osteopathic Medicine, (D.O.) from Philadelphia College of Osteopathic Medicine, and completed his Internal Medicine Residency at the University of Connecticut, where he was awarded "Medical Intern of the Year." Additionally, Dr. Henderson received his Doctor of Jurisprudence (J.D.) from Indiana University Maurer School of Law. Most recently, he completed a fellowship at the National Academies of Science, where he worked with the Institute of Medicine's Board of Global Health.
